Heinz History Center - Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania	As an affiliate of the Smithsonian, the Detre Library & Archives has a strong focus on Western Pennsylvania. They provide online access to digital collections, including historic Pittsburgh newspapers, maps, photographs, yearbooks, and finding aids for their extensive manuscript collections.

New Bedford Whaling Museum - New Bedford, Massachusetts	Maritime records, crew lists, logbooks
New England Historic Genealogical Society (American Ancestors) - Boston, Massachusetts	A comprehensive collection focused on New England and beyond, with digitized vital records, gravestone photographs, obituaries, and family genealogies. This is a subscription-based site, but many libraries offer free access.
New Mexico History Museum - Santa Fe, New Mexico	New Mexico photographs, manuscripts, local history
New York Genealogical & Biographical Society - New York, New York	Specialized New York-focused genealogies, manuscript collections, and research guides for New York City and state families.
New York Public Library - New York, New York	The Irma and Paul Milstein Division of United States History, Local History & Genealogy has an extensive collection. While not everything is digitized, they provide on-site access to premium genealogy databases like Ancestry and Find My Past. They have digitized city directories, newspapers, and images.
New York State Library - Albany, New York	State records, county histories, census substitutes, manuscripts, and extensive New York-focused vital and land records.
Newberry Library - Chicago, Illinois	Major humanities and local-history collections: published genealogies, local/county records, church records, newspapers, maps, and subscription databases on-site.
